PULL TOGETHER

I was scrolling through articles on my phone the other day when a headline caught my attention; "91-Year-Old Spends Years Collecting Pull Tops." The article quickly related that a Wisconsin woman was known in the neighborhood to spend hours going through her neighbors' trash, including the trash dumpsters at a local sports arena. Heavens! I thought, I have problems going up and down the stairs while this 91-year-old woman is climbing in and out of trash dumpsters. What in the world?! But then I learned that Ruth Hana, who grew up in an orphanage, had a goal of collecting one-million pull tops to donate to **The Ronald McDonald House.** These pull tops eventually would be recycled to help families have a place to stay while their seriously ill or injured children received medical treatment at area hospitals. Then a few memories started coming back to me.

I first thought of young Chelsea, Jan Davidson's granddaughter, who needed a heart transplant at the age of 14. This was not in her hometown but in St. Petersburg, Florida. Jan, traveling there from Tennessee, had never heard of the Ronald McDonald House but soon learned it was right next to the hospital. Jan remembers, "For a very minimal fee, we were given adequate housing, including all necessities, access to a comfy community room with television, a gift shop, plus a huge kitchen filled with several refrigerators, stoves, and all anyone would need to prepare or reheat a meal. Agencies and businesses brought in loads of food, packaged and fresh, that we could partake of at any time." Most importantly she adds, "our energies could be directed to visiting our child being cared for in the hospital."

Miah Faircloth and her family also found comfort in a Florida Ronald McDonald House when Ollie, age four at the time, needed to receive treatments only available there for his battle with cancer. "It was like a home away from home," Miah says of their nearly twomonth stay there. "When Ollie wasn't feeling great, the room provided plenty of space for him to relax. His sister Baird was able to have a teacher to allow her to finish the last six weeks of her school year. They provided everything we needed so we could focus on getting through treatment and making Ollie as comfortable as possible."

Brenthaven has been collecting those aluminum pull tops for years. You might not know it but there's a small collection container in the church office. Brenthaven member and Session Representative, Jeri Behan, makes sure those pull tops get to the Nashville Ronald McDonald House. In fact, Jeri is a former volunteer for the agency and remembers the loads of pull tops stored in the basement, waiting for the recycled aluminum to be at its highest market price. "Rooms then were \$115.00 per night but because of the donations, they only charged \$15.00 per night. And if that was a hardship, the room was free." Visitors help with chores at the house, but they can spend most of their time with their loved one.

Jeri and I are going to display that container in the narthex so all can see. We'll place a collection box near our soda machine in the small kitchen and get extra collection boxes for you to take home. Our dog recently switched to canned dog food, so we have a new way to collect pull tops at our home. But regular food cans work, too. Jeri encourages us all to check out the Ronald McDonald House website in

Nashville for their "Dump & Drop Dinner" service to further help families at the home. So how much money did the Wisconsin senior raise with her one-million pull tops? About \$366.00. Might not sound like much, but think of all the nights worried families spent in comfort while waiting for their child to heal, to be able to go home. Not a bad turn around for a piece of trash.
