ROOTS

"There are only two lasting bequests we can hope to give our children. One of these is roots, the other, wings."

—Johann Wolfgang von Goethe

My son, Matthew, lives in downtown Knoxville and just about every morning and evening you can find him walking his dog, Archie, through his neighborhood. Past familiar street corners and buildings, they have their usual path, familiar spots for Archie to stop, and the usual people they may greet. One such person was Linda K. Shropshire, a widely recognized person of Knoxville's unsheltered community. Over the past three years they got to know each other a bit, and Matthew would help her when he could. But then on January 17th, when the ice and snow covered the streets, Linda's body was found behind a dumpster. She was gone, most likely frozen to death. And my son, who doesn't post his political views much on social media, wrote of his sadness of Linda's passing and his urgent plea for help, not only from city government leaders but from those who support the community agencies that help the homeless.

"I am just as guilty as anyone else, if not more. I can in no way sit in an ivory tower and judge when I obviously have not done enough to help these members of our community that also live downtown. And while I can look inward and hope to change, that won't be enough. The ones that are giving their all need more of the collective's help. Public and private can do more, and must do more to help those in our community who already do so much. When the buzz of the next campaign or the next grand opening dies down, I hope more of our collective attention is paid to people like Linda."



And that got me thinking about roots. Where did my sweet baby boy get that compassion? I know Marty and I did our best to bring up Matthew and his brother, Michael, with certain values...roots. But do you know who also provided those roots? You did! This church family called Brenthaven did—the youth group leaders like RheAnn, Kip, Jodi, Joanna, and Lisa Cook to name a few. Marty and I have always been grateful for the local charities and mission trip projects our boys were involved in as teenagers through our church. From Oklahoma, Texas, Mississippi, Missouri, West Virginia, Florida, Tennessee, and our nation's capital, our boys traveled the United States and learned about giving back. From their time spent working on roofs in Appalachia, tiny broken down school cabins on a reservation in Oklahoma, and hurricane-damaged buildings in Mississippi, to their ministry in the

streets and homeless communities of Washington DC, our boys saw, experienced, and learned about those less fortunate. For a few summer days they walked in someone else's shoes, and they learned about true need. They learned

about hardship. They learned about compassion. They experienced a life outside their own safe Brentwood bubble. Roots were planted.

With Ean as their leader, our current Youth Group will head off to Appalachia this June. I so look forward to hearing about their work, the people they will help, and the sadness and joy they will share. But they need our help. These trips cost money. Yes, we could just collect money and give to these agencies we want to help. But what educational value is that to our youth? Yes, we could just let the youth and their parents bear the entire financial



burden. But that doesn't seem very Christian of us. Our youth members will do their best to raise money for their trip. They start **February 25**th with a spaghetti lunch and silent auction following worship. Join them! We can help them. We can all do this. There are roots to be planted. Let's dig deep, Brenthaven, and then, watch these kids spread their wings and fly!


We will begin the season of Lent next week.
