THE VOICES OF THE PEOPLE

This Sunday is Youth Sunday, and I hope you all can be in attendance! Churches and denominations often talk about how important youth are, and yet refuse to hear their voices. We agree that youth are the future of our churches, but refuse to discuss their involvement in the present. Below you will find two different reflections on Genesis 32:22-32 where Jacob wrestles with God. One of these reflections is written by an adult, and the other by a high school senior.

"I am not a competitive person. When you are as goofy of a person as I am, competitions just don't fit. I don't mind simply quitting a game when it is no longer fun or turning it into a joke to make it more enjoyable. Jacob and I are opposites. Jacob finds himself in a competition, wrestling with a strong opponent who turns out to be God. Jacob refuses to let go or give up. The wrestling competition lasts all night long, and Jacob never changes goals or chooses to make a joke out of it. He keeps on pushing even when it is no longer fun.

When I would have in a wrestling match with God, I know what would happen. I would have gotten bored with the activity, made a joke about it, or decided to let go and find something new to do. The more I consider it, I think faith is an everyday wrestling competition, and sometimes when God is pressing against me, trying to make me grow, I give up and refuse to participate in the process. There are times I refuse to engage in the challenging parts of faith with God and times I ignore the stressful process of faith. There are times my faith becomes stationary because I am not like Jacob who was prepared to hold onto God and not give up even when it was difficult. I believe the challenge of this scripture is to understand that the growing pains in faith are necessary, and we should feel compelled to engage in the struggle so our faith can grow."

"Jacob's wrestling with God can be perplexing. It challenged me for many years, which is interesting considering I have few under my belt. Jacob, as a figure, sort of got the short end of the stick in life and used underhanded strategies in an attempt to rectify what he felt he had been shorted. This culminated in some degree of anxiety as he was crossing the river to go see Esau, the individual of whom he had taken advantage. Here on the banks of the river, he was left alone. Only himself, God, and his thoughts kept him company. There, great strife emerged, as he doubtlessly faced some remorse and fear for how his brother might act. Wrestling with God culminates in God's low blow and subsequent blessing of him. In my opinion, this sequence of events shows our relationship with sin. The holy low blow demonstrates the sting of sin, whereas the subsequent limp represents its lasting effects. On the other side, his blessing and rebranding represents the forgiveness of God as he is freed from his cursed past and born again in the name of the Lord, ready to face his brother."

I pray that you will hear both of these valuable voices, that God might speak through them. Please consider attending Youth Sunday to hear six sermons around the theme "This Is My Story," presented by the Youth ROCKS' senior class. I can guarantee that you will be blessed by God through the lives of these youth.


Anna Grace Wooten's robotics team at Brentwood Academy were the tournament champions at the Vex Robotics Tennessee State championship
