# WHAT IS OUR WHY?

One of the words that we first learn as children is the word—WHY? You've seen those parents (or been one) that is almost exhausted from hearing that repetitive chorus of curiosity. First a question: "What is that?" And following a very brilliant parental response, "Why?" "Well, because ..." "But why?" And thus begins the merry-goround of fun and frustration. Now, truth be told, we love the fact they are trying to figure out things. That's good. We want them to be curious, and since it is the shortest of the adverbial questionnaires, it can flow so easily. Almost too easily.

But sometime ago, in a seminary pastoral care class, it was suggested that we refrain from using the word "why." Why you may ask? (See what I did there.) Well, the professor, a very wise pastor and counselor, said that the word "why" has a tendency to put the listener on the defensive, and if the goal is to ascertain information in a positive manner, maybe there were better ways to frame a question. I will admit it sounded a little ridiculous to me. Except that he was proven correct when I realized I made a friend mad after simply asking the reason they chose to do what they did. You would have thought that I had slapped them! So, I have tried really hard to watch how I frame questions, and yes, I fail miserably sometimes.

But that three-letter word came back to haunt me again at a recent conference I attended. This time it wasn't the adverbial usage of the word, but the noun usage. The speaker talked about asking ourselves what was our "why" and staying focused on that as our goal. And though this conference was for seminaries, I immediately began thinking of the church. What is our why? What is the reason for Brenthaven? The easy answer is to spread the Good News of God's grace through Jesus Christ. But we are one of 30–50 churches just on Franklin Road, and that's what they are all doing. So, to be a part of that group is great, but why us? Why here? Why Brenthaven?

Some of you will be expecting me to answer this question right now, but I won't. Why? Because I think it is a question for all of us to consider. One of the best and most frequent comments I ever heard about Brenthaven Church was—"That is the friendliest and most welcoming group of people I've ever seen." That warmed my heart to know people felt the genuine warmth that you project. What a precious gift!!

So, what is our reason for being here? What should we focus on? I don't think it is simply numbers. I don't think it is to be the only Cumberland Presbyterian Church in Brentwood, because most people have never heard of Cumberland Presbyterian, unless they are one. With no disrespect to any church, I have always felt that a church should be available to the community it serves, and I think we do a good job of that. Blood drives, voting precinct, support groups, and a homeschool group are ways we serve. But what else?

As I said, I don't have answers, but challenge you to think through this question with me. I have scriptures that immediately come to mind when I quietly ponder:

You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.'

You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' - Matthew 22:37, 39

Instead, by speaking the truth with love, let's grow in every way into Christ... - Ephesians 4:15

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. - 1 John 4:7

Granted, none of these talk about definitive programs or studies or activities. But they help me focus on the importance of where I believe we are to start—a place of love and grace.

If you have lasted this long in reading, my hope is that you have begun to struggle with our purpose, our mission. What is our *why?* What brings you here? How can we live better into the call God has for Brenthaven? I hope this will open the lines for dialogue as we focus on the future of Brenthaven Church.
